of a sample of 1,022 drivers polled in the U.S. in 2016 would support using tolls to pay for key transportation projects to reduce the time they spend in traffic.



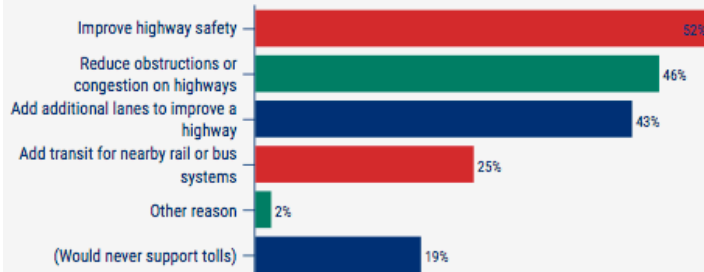
would likely use a tolled highway over a non-tolled highway if they knew it'd save them time and help them avoid traffic.



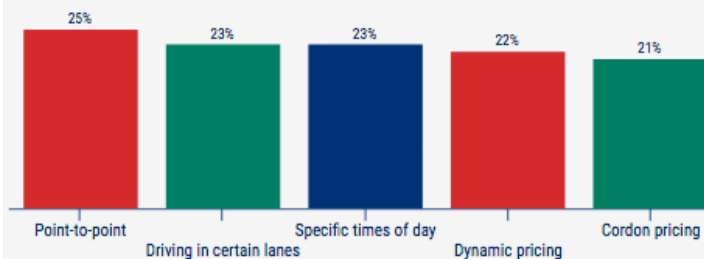
(most) prefer tolls over mileage-based user fees and higher taxes to fund infrastructure.
